


ERNEST BARKER (1904-1960)



♦ Primeiro professor de *Political Science* em Cambridge, de 1928 a 1939. Destaca-se como historiador das ideias políticas, principalmente do período clássico, cabendo-lhe a tradução de Gierke para inglês.
